***Rethinking Logic Models***

Rebecca Rae (Jicarilla Apache), MCRP, MWR, is an Associate Scientist III at the University of New Mexico's Center for Participatory Research within the College of Population Health. She is an Indigenous scholar with over 12 years of experience in developing prevention and intervention programs utilizing Community Based Participatory Research (CBPR), in partnership with local New Mexico Tribes. She works closely with multiple tribal community partners to mentor, strengthen and enhance community members' skills in program development, program implementation, data collection, data analysis, grant writing, research, and evaluation. She also has served as an evaluator to tribal non-profit organizations, tribal programs, and national foundations. She also has ten years of experience in Positive Youth Leadership Development, specifically serving as Senior Faculty with the Leadership Institute Summer Policy Academy (LI/SPA), which educates Native American high-school students on American Indian History, Federal Indian Law, Policy and Advocacy.
